

I would like to welcome our new families who have joined us this week. I hope that you will enjoy being part of our King William Street community as your child moves through the school. It has been a pleasure wandering around the classrooms, listening to the children discussing their work and watching them challenge themselves. Many families are struggling against the tide of the rising cost of living, and more are set to join them. To help with this, have you checked to see if

your child is entitled to benefits related free school meals? Every child who receives benefits related free school meals will also receive a Pupil Premium Grant. This will be used by the school to fund:

- School trips & residential visits
- workshops and theatre performances etc.

- after-school activities
- peripatetic music lessons
- school uniform
- breakfast club

Where appropriate, the school will also provide access to additional support for your child's learning and/or well-being.

These benefits will last for six years even if you are only eligible for free school meals for a short period of time. There are many families who could be eligible but have not yet applied for a range of reasons. I would encourage everyone to click on the link below and see if you are eligible for Free School Meals. All you need is your National Insurance number.

Attention all parents/carers

If your child is currently in Year 6 – you need to apply for a Secondary School place by 31st October 2022.



Do you have a spare hour each week? If so, would you consider helping in school?

We'd love to have more people hearing our children read so that they become confident and enthusiastic readers. Reading regularly to an adult has been shown to significantly increase the rate of progress that children can make with their learning. During the hour, you would work with 3-4 children on an individual basis, spending 15-20 minutes with each child. The time would be spent reading and talking about their book. You'd work with the same children each week so that you would get to know them and watch them progress.
